

In Literacy the children have reflected on their descriptive writing from last week about daffodils and have added exciting adjectives to make their writing even better!

In maths, the children have been exploring odd and even numbers. They have used resources to make pairs which helped them identify if there was "one on it's own" and so an odd amount of resources. They then sorted numbers into a table showing odd and even numbers.

In our topic sessions this week, the children have explored different flags and created their own. They have continued to create their own Welsh folk dance and written part of the Welsh national anthem as part of the Eisteddfod handwriting competition.

This week, Year 1 have been busy preparing for the Eisteddfod by drawing pictures of the Welsh flag. At first, we found it quite challenging to copy the flag accurately from a picture. After our initial attempts, we watched a video called *Austin's Butterfly*, which tells the story of a young boy who, through resilience, determination, and reflection, continually improved his butterfly drawing.

Inspired by the video, the children shared their drawings with each other and gave thoughtful feedback on 'what went well' and 'even better if' to help their friends improve. With this feedback in mind, they had another go at drawing the flag—and the progress they made was incredible! I am so proud of their determination, perseverance, and positive attitude. Just look at the improvements they achieved!

A week filled with Eisteddfod activity in year 5. We have been building up to and writing our Eisteddfod poems inspired on the Seasons of Wales.


We also applied our pastel skills onto landscape art inspired by a Welsh artist, Chris Neale. The children were really determined and resilient when completing their artwork.
