Administration of Medication

School's policy is not to routinely administer medication to pupils. This is not because we don't want to, but there are a number of practical safety factors which mean that it is impractical to do so. In order to manage this policy responsibly we would ask that where you can, please schedule your child's medication so that they don't need a dose during the school day. We know that this isn't always possible, and, if your child does need medication during school hours, the following will happen:

- Only prescription medications will be administered, where absolutely necessary
- We will only issue non-prescription medicines in exceptional circumstances, with the agreement of the headteacher.
- Medications must be brought into schools in their original container, as dispensed by a pharmacist, labelled with your child's name. They must include instructions for administration, dosage and storage, as well as possible side effects.
- You must complete a medication form provided by school for your child to be given the medication.
 Please do not send medication in with your children without the medication form being completed and agreed by the Headteacher.

Building Work - Mynydd Bach Access

Work has been delayed again until **Monday 2nd December** and will last for approximately 4-6 weeks. During this time parents and children will not be able to use this gate to enter or exit the school.

The staff parking area should not be used for drop off or pick up at any time - this includes after school club and breakfast club. When work does commence, we will be closing the red gate to the staff car park during this time to minimise risk to our pupils and parents and disruption to the contractors.

Vacancy on Shirenewton Community Council

Shirenewton Community Council has a vacancy for a Councillor in the Shirenewton and Mynyddbach ward

What is a Councillor?

Councillors are elected to represent an individual geographical unit on the council, known as a ward or parish. They are generally elected by the public every five years. Between the elections if a Councillor seat becomes available it can be filled by the Council Co-opting the applicant onto the Council. A seat for Co-option has now become available.

What do Councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work.

- Decision making Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide
 which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies
 should be implemented.
- Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available, and may include:
 - Going to meetings of local organisations
 - Going to meetings of bodies affecting the wider community
 - Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public

How much time does it take up?

Quite often councillors say that their duties occupy them for about an hour a week. Obviously, there are some councillors who spend more time than this – and some less, but in the main, being a community councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to your community and helping to make it a better place to live and work.

You will be supported in your role and will be expected to undertake training. You should be comfortable working electronically. You should have a positive outlook and a can-do attitude and be willing to work as part of a team.
