WELCOME BACK!

STRIKE ACTION

This week the coverage of the decision by the NEU to move to industrial action has been widespread. At this point in time I am unable to give a clear picture of the impact that any strike action will have on learning at Shirenewton Primary School. As soon as I am in a position to do so, I will let parents know. For your information, the dates of planned action in Wales are as follow:

- 1 February national strike across England and Wales
- 14 February national strike across Wales

CSSR & INSET DAYS

Last week, we had visitors from the EAS (Education Achievement Service) to carry out a CSSR Review - looking at things they could Celebrate, Share, Support and Refine within our school. The outcomes of this fed into our INSET Days, where we continue to develop and improve our school environment, as well as the teaching and learning opportunities we provide the children. It was a great way to reflect and focus on a way forward and we are very excited about the changes and developments we plan to make.



GUIDED GROUP READING

We have been reviewing our approach to the teaching of reading across the school, through Read Write Inc sessions in Reception to Year 2. If your child is in these year groups they will still be having their diet of RWI, and home readers will continue to be sent home.

Developing these important skills from Year 3 onwards will also be a focus. If your child is in Year 3 and beyond, we will ensure that they take part in a Guided Group Reading Session with a teacher in their classroom. These sessions are designed to develop your child's reading skills - not just decoding and encoding, but developing their understanding of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, sequence and summary. These Guided Reading Sessions will take place as soon as your child gets into school, so please make every effort to get them here on time. As well as this session, we will make sure that we send a book home each week with your child, along with a Reading Record.

The Reading Record will be filled in by the class teacher once a week - it may be a short comment about a skill they have developed, an achievement observed, or just a general well done! There will be a place for you to comment on your child's reading too.

Please do:

Use it as a place to celebrate listening to your child read with you, and let them (and us!) know you enjoyed it

Please don't:

Use it as a place to communicate with your child's class teacher. If there are any worries or concerns you may have about their progress, please make an appointment with them so that your concerns can be addressed in the best way.

Children will have an opportunity to change their book weekly - unless of course it is longer in nature. These 'home readers are designed to develop their reading skills at home. We won't send a book home at the 'instructional' level we are teaching them in school. Rather, we will always send books at a level which your child's class teacher believes they will be able to access and enjoy at home. Your child will be able to choose these books themselves from a selection of books. Please bear with us - we have a wide selection of books in school which we are going to be rebanding over the coming weeks and months. Of course if your children have books at home that they would prefer to read, they are more than welcome - we would still love to hear from you about it through a comment in their reading records.

Y6 VIRTUAL DINOSAUR WORKSHOP

Y6 had a wonderful start to their topic which included a virtual dinosaur workshop provided by Cardiff Museum.
